The Transportation Industry

Transportation is a thriving and comprehensive industry. It incorporates all forms of human modality—heavy and light rail, aviation, automotive, human-powered means—and draws on the knowledge and skill sets from various fields and educational backgrounds. The evolution of innovative transportation requires minds trained in many disciplines including architecture, engineering, mathematics, geography, political science, policy, economics, finance, planning, environmental science, communications, and more.

Despite the broad range of educational backgrounds that can lead to a career in transportation, women continue to be under-represented in transportation-related occupations.¹

WTS Scholarship

The WTS Toronto Chapter aims to further the development of the transportation industry through gender diversification within the local workforce. In an effort to promote gender diversity and attract young talent, a scholarship has been established where \$3,000 CAD scholarships will be awarded to a minimum of one postgraduate and two undergraduate or college students, plus one Indigenous undergraduate student. Additional awards may be granted based on available funding. In the event that there are no qualified postgraduate candidates, additional awards may be granted to undergraduate students.

We are also offering one focused scholarship for undergraduate students pursuing studies within emerging technologies such as electrical engineering, autonomous systems, computer science and programming, math systems,

artificial intelligence and machine learning, cyber analytics and fusion engineering.

General Scholarships are open to students who:

- Are pursuing a degree that will lead to a career in transportation, such as those listed above and demonstrates strong academic performance. Programs not listed may qualify if the student can demonstrate how their studies will lead to a career in transportation.
- Have a demonstrable interest in promoting the advancement of gender diversity within the transportation industry.
- Are registered full-time at a university or college in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area and the Kitchener/Waterloo/Guelph area in 2024. ([See full list of eligible institutions](#))

Indigenous Scholarship

- In addition to the above requirements, this scholarship is for post-secondary school students who identify as Indigenous (First Nations, Métis, and Inuit). Indigenous Scholarships are open ontario-wide to any full-time student registered in a Canadian post-secondary institution.

Focused Scholarship – Emerging Technologies

- In addition to the above requirements for general scholarships, applicants must also demonstrate their connection to emerging technologies (Internet of Things (IoT), and/or Artificial Intelligence (AI) and/or Autonomous Systems and Systems Engineering (SE)) and how these technologies contribute to solving a transportation problem.

Scholarship recipients will be selected and notified in late October, and presented with the award at the WTS annual event. WTS is now offering free memberships to students who are pursuing a degree that will lead them to a career in transportation to facilitate their introduction to the industry and provide an opportunity to begin building their professional network.

Past WTS Toronto Area Chapter (TAC) Scholarship award recipients are not eligible for subsequent awards from the TAC.
