As Garver's Southwest Regional Director for Transportation and a vice president for the firm, Wendy Travis, AICP, has paved the way for women in the transportation industry for nearly three decades. Wendy has been instrumental in growing Garver's Transportation Planning and Environmental Team to more than 20 experts spanning four states and now leads the firm's transportation efforts across one of its biggest markets: Texas. An expert in corridor planning, environmental studies, public involvement, program management, and much more, Wendy's work has shaped communities across the United States.

Wendy's impact on the transportation industry extends beyond her work with critical infrastructure projects. As the nation faces a shortage of engineering graduates, she recognizes the critical need to invest in tomorrow's engineering professionals. Wendy leads networking and professional development opportunities for women in the firm as a leader in Garver Connect, an employee-led initiative designed in part to support the firm through the recruitment and retention of female engineers. Additionally, she's passionate about STEM education and sparking an early interest in engineering in today's young learners. Through GarverGives, the firm's giving program, Wendy volunteered with the Bullock Texas State History Museum to lead STEM-focused activities for elementary students and served as a mentor for SafetyHack, a hands-on event led by TxDOT and Garver that challenged students from the Ann Richards School for Young Women Leaders to brainstorm and present highway safety solutions.

Lindsay Liggett is a professional engineer with over 15 years of highway design experience at the schematic and PS&E levels. She received her B.S. and M.S. in Civil Engineering from Texas A&M University and joined RTG as a Project Engineer in 2019. Lindsay currently serves as the deputy project manager and roadway task lead for the FM 324 schematic and PS&E project in Lufkin, which includes a realignment of the existing roadway and the addition of a half-mile long bridge that spans the adjacent creek and UPRR tracks. Lindsay also currently serves as the traffic control task lead for the US 59 Direct Connector project in Victoria and has also recently served as the roadway task lead for the SH 114 Super 2 project in Wichita Falls. She also helped develop the traffic control design for the I-10 widening project in Colorado County, the I-35 widening project in Wichita Falls, and the CapEx South project in Travis County.

Lindsay's involvement with the WTS Heart of Texas Chapter began when she received one of the chapter's first scholarships in 2006. She later became a member of the chapter in 2009 and has served in various capacities, including as Scholarship Committee Chair in the past and on both the gala and scholarship committees currently.

Lindsay is an original Austinite and enjoys running, hiking, exploring new places, and binging podcasts and audiobooks. She also enjoys spending time with her husband, Ben, and their two boys and can often be found cheering from the sidelines of a baseball or soccer field.
